Our rich history began in the early 1900's when a group of women formed the National Association of Bank Women (NABW) which grew into a worldwide organization known as Financial Women International (FWI). FWI continued to grow and flourish until the Financial Crisis of 2008. At that time, FWI saw a drastic decline in membership which forced them to make the difficult decision to disband.

However, the women of the Texas District refused to give up all the benefits of an association dedicated to helping women succeed by strengthening our leadership skills, offering professional development, and creating invaluable networking and mentoring opportunities.

In 2009, Financial Women in Texas was established with 83 members and five founding groups still committed to helping women succeed. We've grown to nearly 200 members and 10 groups today with interest in additional areas where we hope to form new groups soon.

- December 10 or 17, 2020- Trying to get a consensus to see if we can do a Holiday gathering




East Texas members Sonya Lawrence, Janet Sledge, Pam Mitchell, Tammy Gibbons and Laura Rogers attended conference.
